GOLF CHAIRMAN: Don Wagner

Thank You to everyone who stayed over after our guest speaker to participate in our golf meeting on Sept. 14th. We had a great turnout with some good discussions. Our TD Jm Reese brought us up to date on changes including MP, Club Championship, our updated 2021 schedule including Members Appreciation Day (Oct 21st) and our Awards Banquet (Nov 9th). The Banquet will be held following our members luncheon (all 2021 golf members lunches will be paid for by the golf club) in leu of a guest speaker. Gary Adams who maintains our SIR 102 web site is also our Assist TD and is currently working on our golf schedule for 2022. Our Treasurer John Thomas reported on our financials which included our MAD and Awards Banquet. Dan Johnson reported that we have about 7 foursome heading for Rolling Hills which will bring us back after a 1 1/2 year absence. We also had an open discussion on slow play. While we have a strong reputation with most courses on our ability to play within 4 1/2 hours, there are still times when we exceed that commitment for up to 5 1/2 hours. Several suggestions were made to keep each foursome more aware of when they are holding up others for an extensive time. In addition to giving the Marshalls a copy of our procedures, the golf board is currently considering a change in policy which requires each foursome to police the slow play policy themselves.

Any recommendations we have for policy and procedure changes will be sent out to all golf members for review prior to our awards banquet. At that banquet we will vote on our officers for 2022 and also Board recommended Policy and Procedures changes. These two functions always occur at our Annual Awards Banquet where we have more members in attendance.

TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR: Jim Reese

We will be holding our Members' Appreciation Day (MAD) on Oct. 21st at Teal Bend this year with free coffee in the morning and a sandwich wrap after the round. In the next few days the number of 102 golf rounds each of you played in 2021 will be emailed and posted on our branch's website. As of August 31, over 49 members have qualified for either a free day or only have to pay half the cost. If you haven't signed up to attend MAD you must let me know by the 15th. If any money is due it will be collected at the course. Since it's a MAD we will have a Max's Rule Scramble where we don't count drives and where the ball doesn't have to be on the green to be measured for the Closest to the Pin contest (balls in the sand bunker don't count). Prizes will be distributed after the round.

We will start collecting your 2022 NCGA and SIR 102 Golf Club (GC) dues using the November signup sheet. The 2022 dues will be \$80 - \$39 NCGA dues, \$31 102 GC dues, and \$10 surcharge for 2022. The surcharge will put the GC in a sound financial position. When State SIR suspended golf during the 2020 season and again during the 2021 due to the pandemic it put a crimp in your GC's budget. Your 2020 GC board voted to give cash to all qualified members for MAD and cash to all members for the Award Banquet. They did it with hope of keeping the GC together. It worked, although we lost a few members and with the new members, the membership stayed over 100 members. Your 2021 GC board voted to continue MAD, to hold the 2021 Award Banquet after the November luncheon, and to pay the luncheon fee for all GC members that attend. The November signup sheet will be emailed and posted on the website by the 13th. Since the branch's picnic on the 15th will replace the October luncheon, you can mail the signup sheets with a check, at the picnic, or turn them in at the golf course on the 14th and 21st.

The last two months' signup sheets have been used to collect the new Hole in One insurance plan and the 2022 Branch (Gold Pan) dues. So far, 56 and 55 members respectively have used the signup sheets to make their payments. The Johns (Thomas and Slingerland) and I appreciate you using the signup sheets for your payments.

As you read this, 27 of golfers will be playing Rolling Hills over two days on our second overnighter of the year. I'm counting our modified Carson City trip as the first overnighter of 2021

Gary Adams has contacted all the golf courses' TDs that are on our purposed 2022 Golf Schedule. At this time your board's nominating committee is looking to add to the waiting list of members wanting to keep our golf club strong by volunteering a few hours next year to serve on the golf board. If you would like to give some time back to the golf club you can contact Don Wagner.
